Dear Friend:

Welcome to the latest edition of *HealthRays*TM *Update*, an electronic newsletter that provides you with news and developments from the <u>HealthRays initiative</u> – Rotary District 6440's effort to bring digital x-ray technology to needy populations in Guatemala – and eventually, around the world.

More and more Rotarians – in the United States and internationally – are learning about our project and joining us, and we have a lot of news to share in this issue of the newsletter.



First, we are delighted to say that our installation schedule is back on track after being temporarily interrupted during the political upheavals in Guatemala last fall and winter. During this period of turmoil, some governmental regulatory processes were affected, including customs regulations for imported goods. But the customs process is now fully functioning again in Guatemala and we are busily planning new installations.

Our fundraising continues at a steady pace, and we are delighted to announce that we have now surpassed the \$600,000 mark in funding commitments, with more than 50 clubs and 15 Rotary districts participating so far!

We are now working on installation plans for our <u>ninth</u> and <u>tenth</u> digital x-ray units. When those units are installed, we will be more than one third of the way toward meeting our goals.

Our progress continues to draw attention and support from individuals and organizations outside the Rotary world. You can learn more in the article below about letters of support we recently received from U.S. Representatives Jan Schakowsky and Robert Dold – two members of the U.S. Congress who strongly back our efforts.

We are also excited to report that we have trademarked our name, HealthRays – part of our ongoing effort to raise our visibility widely.

As you can see, HealthRays is making great progress! Stay tuned – we will keep you posted on new developments.

New HealthRays Installations Expected This Summer

The HealthRays project is expected to take a major step forward this summer when three new digital x-ray installations are scheduled for completion in Guatemala.

If everything stays on schedule, digital x-ray units will soon be installed in **Livingston**, **Villa Canales** and **Palencia**, bringing the total number of units that are up and running to six. Installation of a seventh unit, scheduled for **Fraijanes**, may also be completed during the summer.

In addition to these units, which will begin operation very soon, several other installations are currently in development, including an eighth unit, to be located in **Gualan**, and ninth and tenth units for locations in Guatemala that will be determined later in 2016.

When the next three clinics are installed in his summer, the total estimated population that will have access to digital x-ray technology will be 300,000 to 600,000 Guatemalans.

An installation ceremony, observing HealthRays' progress to date, is being planned

for the Palencia clinic in Guatemala on August 25, 2016.

We will keep you posted on progress as additional installations continue.

Members of U.S. House of Representatives Back HealthRays

HealthRays recently received the support of two members of the U.S. House of Representatives from Illinois – **Rep. Robert J. Dold** (R-10th Congressional District) and **Rep. Jan Schakowsky** (D-9th Congressional District).

In separate letters of endorsement, Representatives Dold and Schakowsky strongly backed the efforts of the HealthRays project in addressing global health issues by providing crucial medical services to patients in need in Guatemala.

Press in Guatemala Provides News Coverage of HealthRays

Since its inception, the HealthRays project has received continuing coverage from a variety of media outlets in Guatemala. Members of the press, including newspapers and broadcast outlets, have attended HealthRays installation ceremonies in the past and continue to provide good coverage of our efforts.

A recent example is a story, right, that appeared in the Guatemalan newspaper *Nuestro Diario Oriente*.

It is important to remember that our project is impacting many lives in Guatemala – and as we continue to add new clinics, it will impact many more. Guatemala has one of the highest rates of poverty in Central America, and our services are making a difference for people in need – that's why the local media is interested in our work.

Members of the HealthRays steering committee periodically travel to Guatemala and we will keep you informed about future news coverage as more clinics are completed.



District 6440 Clubs Continue to Pledge Their Support for HealthRays -- Total Now Stands at 49

HealthRays In Brief

As many as four billion people around the globe - basically two-thirds of the entire population – have little or no access to simple x-ray technology, which is taken for granted as a basic health tool in most industrialized nations.

Rotarians in <u>Rotary International District 6440</u> - near Chicago, Illinois – have launched an effort to address this problem, with a new cross-sector model for action that we have introduced in Guatemala and hope to replicate eventually in countries around the world. Working with the Guatemalan government and the PAHO, our primary goal is to install 29 digital x-ray units in underserved areas throughout Guatemala.

Eventually, our project will impact more than one and a half million people in that country, where health care outcomes are among the worst in Central America.
